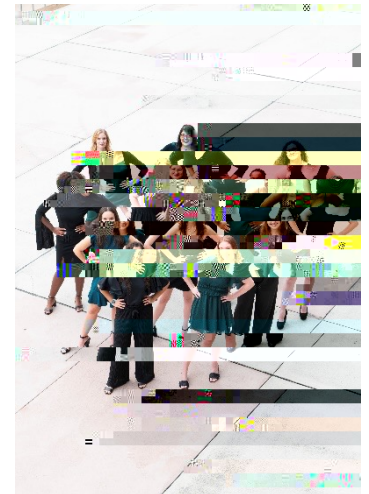
## Performer Biographies



**Professor Dina Barone** is a professional musician and educator with vast experience in Concert and Opera. She holds a Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance and a Bachelor of Music Literature from Shenandoah Conservatory of Music, a Master of Music in Opera from the Hartt School of Music, and extensive post-graduate studies in New York City as a private student and associate teacher of internationally renowned, master teacher, David Jones. She has performed at such venues as New York's Carnegie Hall & Weill Hall, the Town Hall, St. Patrick's Cathedral, Brooklyn Academy of

Music & the Caramoor Center for Music & the Arts, Washington D.C.'s the Kennedy Center & the National Cathedral, Paris' Notre Dame Cathedral, Cologne's Cathedral, Hartford's Bushnell Theatre, Philadelphia's the Walnut Street Theatre, Jacksonville's the Times Union Performing Arts Center and various other venues. From 2011 – 2017 she was a faculty member at the Grammy Award winning Douglas Anderson School of the Arts. Dina has been a JU faculty member since 2017 where she created and directs the elite Vocal Jazz Ensemble – the RiverTones.

A highly auditioned ensemble, **the RiverTones** specialize in vocal jazz, pop & contemporary a cappella music. They most recently enjoyed the honor of performing at the Jacksonville University 2022-2023 matriculation and their first performance of the National Anthem for the Jumbo Shrimp, Jacksonville's professional baseball team. A sought-after ensemble, they were the headliner for Jazz Jam! at the Ponce de Leon Concert Hall in 2021. They have performed on the Penney Farms Concert Series and opened the nationally recognized Generation W's 2018 Conference. This fall, they will host the third annual JU Contemporary Vocal Festival with world-renowned guest conductor and clinician, **Deke Sharon**. In January, they will make their Walt Disney World debut, performing music from this concert! Join them in March, for their Signature Concert SpringSing!: We Got Treble! with the treble singers of Choral Union and University Singers.



**Dr. Julian David Bryson** is Director of Choral Activities at Jacksonville University (FL), where he leads three ensembles and teaches courses in conducting, musical theatre, and music appreciation. Previously, Julian served on the faculty of Curry College in Milton, MA and was a founding member of Triad: Boston's Choral Collective. He has taught elementary, middle, and high school musicians at Randolph School of Huntsville, AL and Carlisle School of Martinsville, VA and holds a doctoral degree in Choral Conducting from the University of Kentucky, writing his dissertation on choral collectives. He also earned degrees in conducting and composition from the University of Tennessee. As a composer, he has earned national recognition including

winning the Raymond W. Brock Student Composition Contest sponsored by the American Choral Directors Association and the Yale Glee Club Emerging Composers Competition. His composition, *the Field (ubi caritas)* won third place in the American Prize Competition for Major Choral Works.

**Choral Union** is an ensemble that truly lives up to its name. Bringing together all constituencies of our university community, this choir welcomes students of all majors, faculty, staff, alumni, parents, and neighbors. We sing a wide variety of repertoire and frequently join with other JU ensembles to present major works. Selected annually by audition, the members of the **Jacksonville University Singers** perform an eclectic and challenging repertoire spanning the centuries and the globe including Renaissance polyphony, Baroque and Classical masterworks, folksongs, music theatre, opera and new music by living composers. The University Singers have performed for conferences of the American Choral Directors Association, the Florida Music Educators Association, and the Music Teachers National Association.

Other notable performances include concerts in New York's Avery Fisher Hall and St. Patrick's Cathedral, England's Canterbury Cathedral, Chartres Cathedral, La Madeline – Paris, the Basilica of St. Nicholas – Nantes, TEDx Jacksonville, and numerous collaborations with the Jacksonville Symphony Orchestra. The University Singers give many performances each year on campus, in the community, and on tour, most recently to open the Daytona International Speedway CokeZero 400.
